As part of the ongoing "People in Our Community", students recently had the opportunity to engage with Mayor Rabie during a visit. The mayor spoke about the day-to-day responsibilities and challenges faced as the local mayor. Mayor Rabie shared insights into the various aspects of municipal governance, including decision-making processes, community engagement, and the management of local projects. During the visit, students were encouraged to ask questions and they took full advantage of the opportunity.

Inspired by the discussion and motivated to make a difference, the students are now rallying together to organise a petition for a new skate park/pump track. This initiative reflects their desire to enhance their community's recreational facilities. Skiing


Skiing scheduled for August 30th has been cancelled. Please stay tuned for updates regarding the sessions on September 6th and 13th.
